And as their business has grown, so has their space: they've undergone a 2,800-square-foot expansion, which brings the store to nearly 5,000 square feet including the addition of a Rolex Corner, a glass wall behind the new bridal counter that allows customers to watch jewelers craft their masterpieces in the Custom Design Studio, and a champagne bar where guests can enjoy a sip and a nosh while they peruse the store's 20-plus brands—the perfect place to raise a glass in honor of their anniversary.
